Recording Race Data

Written records are needed for PRO decisions, race scoring, protest resolution.

Keep notes for all the details listed below, depending on your boat.

Print, and print clearly.

Write the TIME for every item (synch your watch to GPS).

Recording is done on all RC boats:

Signal boat

- ✓ Competitor check-in (who checks in, variations in sail numbers, etc.)
- ✓ For EVERY race start, confirm/write:
 - Race Course/Distance/Bearing as posted, and any changes
 - Start sequence steps flags and sounds (normal, variations)
 - o Boats OCS "On Course Side", and when each boat cleared
- ✓ PRO's decisions and commands (what/why/who) (e.g., Execute Charlie)
- ✓ Events during the race (e.g., boat retires, mark dragging, announcements) as seen and as heard over VHF
- ✓ Mark locations (lat/lon) as radioed in, including Signal boat
- ✓ Wind readings
- ✓ Finishes on a Finish Sheet (boat+time, any bravo flags)
- ✓ RC dock time

Mark boats

- ✓ Mark drop locations (all)
- ✓ Wind readings over time
- ✓ Mark roundings (sequence of sail numbers, with times when feasible)
- ✓ Race starts and finishes, if backing up Signal boat
- ✓ Any events that happen or are observed which might affect race or racers (e.g., a boat doing circles, bravo flags, mark dragging)

Try not to erase – draw a line through any mistake and rewrite. Print clearly.

Compare finish sheets after each race, to be sure everyone agrees.

Ensure master finish sheet is clear/legible, else make a clean, unambiguous copy.

Check the focus on photos taken of finish sheets before sending to the Scorer (a)
